
The Colossus of Rhodes








North-South Divides





ANGOLA: Note Cabinda Province is not connected to the rest of the country








Mapping Africa's natural resources





Sub-Saharan African merchindise trade with China





Burundi


- >90% employment in agric.
- Agric = 40% of GDP
- 2013 X = \$113m
- 2013 M = \$873m
- X = coffee, tea, sugar, hides
- M = finished goods, petrol
- Aid = 42% of national income
- Colonial powers significant trade partners + neighbours and China/Pakistan

Burkina Faso

- GNI/cap = \$710
- >80% in susbsistence farming
- X = cotton, livestock, gold
- Gold dramatically increased X over last few years
- M = finished goods, petrol, food
- France, Canada, Japan, China, India, Indonesia, Bangladesh main trade partners






